Development of a review protocol (publication planned)

1. Identification of the research gab (access to health care service)

Existing reviews of psychosocial barriers of individuals with type 2 diabetes focus on:

- defined interventions (e.g., poor control of type 2 diabetes mellitus, self-management, education)
- defined outcomes (e.g., quality of live)

The aim of the systematic review is to

- identify and to analyse knowledge on psychosocial barriers for the access to health care service of individuals with type 2 diabetes and
- (2) to investigate **differences between countries** considering the patient characteristics.



Development of a review protocol (publication planned)

2. Development of the search strategy

- Definition of inclusion- and exclusion criteria, primary endpoints
- Search time-scale
- Data-bases: Cochrane Library, MEDLINE, EMBASE, PsycINFO, CINAHL, Web of Science, OVID Journals, ScienceDirect etc.



Development of a review protocol (publication planned)

- 3. Identification of the literature
- 4. Pre-test of the title- and abstract screening
- 5. Data collection: Data extraction and analysis following the "Anderson model"





Discussion: review focus

"Psychosocial barriers for access to health care service"



Discussion: 6 Dimensions of access [Anderson et al. 2001]

- 1. "Potential access"
- 2. "Realized access"
- 3. "Equitable access"
- 4. "Inequitable access"
- 5. "Effective access"
- 6. "Efficient access"

(enabling variables, e.g., regular provided care, health policy, financing) (actual use of services, e.g., the use of physician) (determinants that predict equal utilization, e.g., age, ethnicity) (enabling resources determine who gets care) (achieved access with a result of satisfaction) (minimizing the resources required to attain improved outcomes)
