Metro: Plaza Castilla and Chamartín Stations (10-15 minutes walking)


Bus: Line 147. Stop in Calle Sinesio Delgado

TRANSPORT FROM THE AIRPORT

TAXI:

THE CURRENT FARE FOR A TAXI TRIP TO DOWNTOWN MADRID IS A FIXED PRIZE OF 30 €



Terminal 1 (T1) – ground floor, located across the Hall 2 of the baggage claim.

Terminal 2 (T2) – ground floor, located across the Hall 5 of the baggage claim.

Terminal 3 (T3) – ground floor, located across the Hall 7 of the baggage claim.

Terminal 4 (T4) - ground floor.

METRO:



From T1, T2, T3 or T4:

METRO: Line 8 (pink) connects Barajas airport to the center of town, station change line in Colombia and take line 9 to Plaza Castilla. It takes about 25 minutes to reach the hotel is in the same plaza.

BUS:



Line number 200 connects the Barajas airport terminals 1-2-3 with the City Centre (Metro station Avenida de América, lines 4, 6, 7, 9).

Bus line 204 connects the T 4 with the City Centre (Metro station Avenida de América, lines 4, 6, 7, 9).

AEROCITY

AeroCity is a specialised taxi service which can be reserved in advance from our website. They will pick you up at the airport in a comfortable, air-conditioned, 7-seater van and take you to whichever destination you specify, guaranteeing a maximum of 3 stops on the way. Their drivers will sometimes speak English and prices currently stand at 23 euros total for up to 3 passengers, 26 euros for 4 (6.50 euros per person!) and only slightly more for more people. door service. Cheaper than a normal taxi. Disadvantages: you may have to share your "taxi" with others. Cost: 23 euros for 1, 2 or 3 persons.

MOVING AROUND MADRID

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN MADRID

Madrid proudly sports one of the best public transportation networks in the world and the second largest metro network in Europe, second only to London's. Buses and subways form an integrated network and work with the same tickets. A single ticket (*Billete de un viaje*) costs €1,5, a ten trip ticket (*billete de diez viajes*) costs €12,2. Tickets can be purchased at Metro stations, news-stands, and "Estancos" (tobacconists').

CITY TURISTIC INFORMATION

Madrid, the capital city of Spain, is one of the major tourist spots of Europe and is best known for its zestful nightclubs, outstanding shopping centers and life-celebrating art. Madrid is characterised by intense cultural and artistic activity and a very lively nightlife. Madrid is a paradise for museum lovers. There are 15 important museums, dozens of galleries and several private collections. The most famous museums in Madrid are the Prado (right across the meeting venue), the Thyssen Bornemisza and the Reina Sofia museum.



Apart from the art museums, there is much more to see and do in Madrid. You will enjoy a lovely walk in warm sunshine in Retiro Park, one of Madrid's most popular attractions.



Bars and restaurants are open very late in Madrid and the city's Santa Ana district never closes down. Dinner in Madrid usually does not begin until after 10 pm and after that you can head off to your favorite disco show, jazz club or late-night café.

You will also enjoy shopping in Madrid. Gran Via is Madrid's most well known avenue for shopping but there are dozens of others such as Calle Alcala, Calle Montera, Calle Princesa, Calle Serrano.

LAPTOPS AND INTERNET IN MADRID

If you are bringing any electrical appliances to Spain (e.g. laptop computers, travel irons, etc.) you should bear in mind the voltage and type of plug used here. Spain uses the 220V voltage level and a frequency of 50Hz. Check that your electrical appliances will work with this voltage. You may also need a plug adapter. Spain uses plugs with 2 round pins (see image).



Wi-Fi Internet access is common in many hotels, apartments and other places such as the cafeterias of the large department store, El Corte Ingles.
