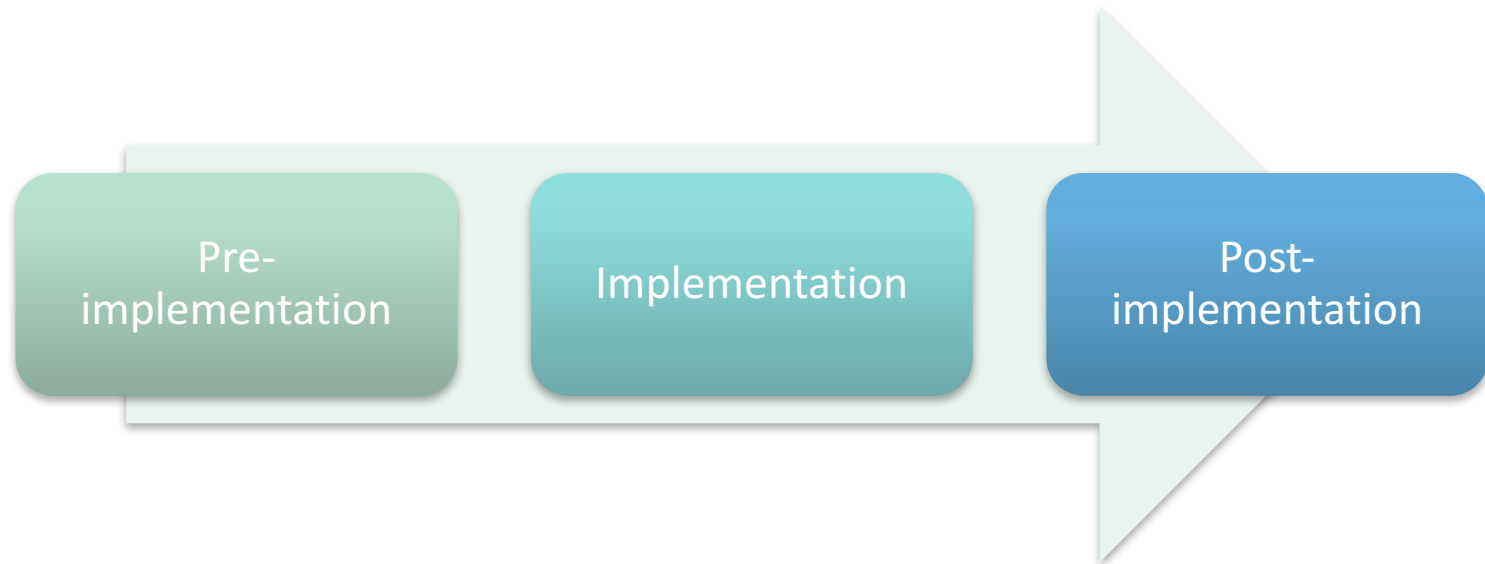

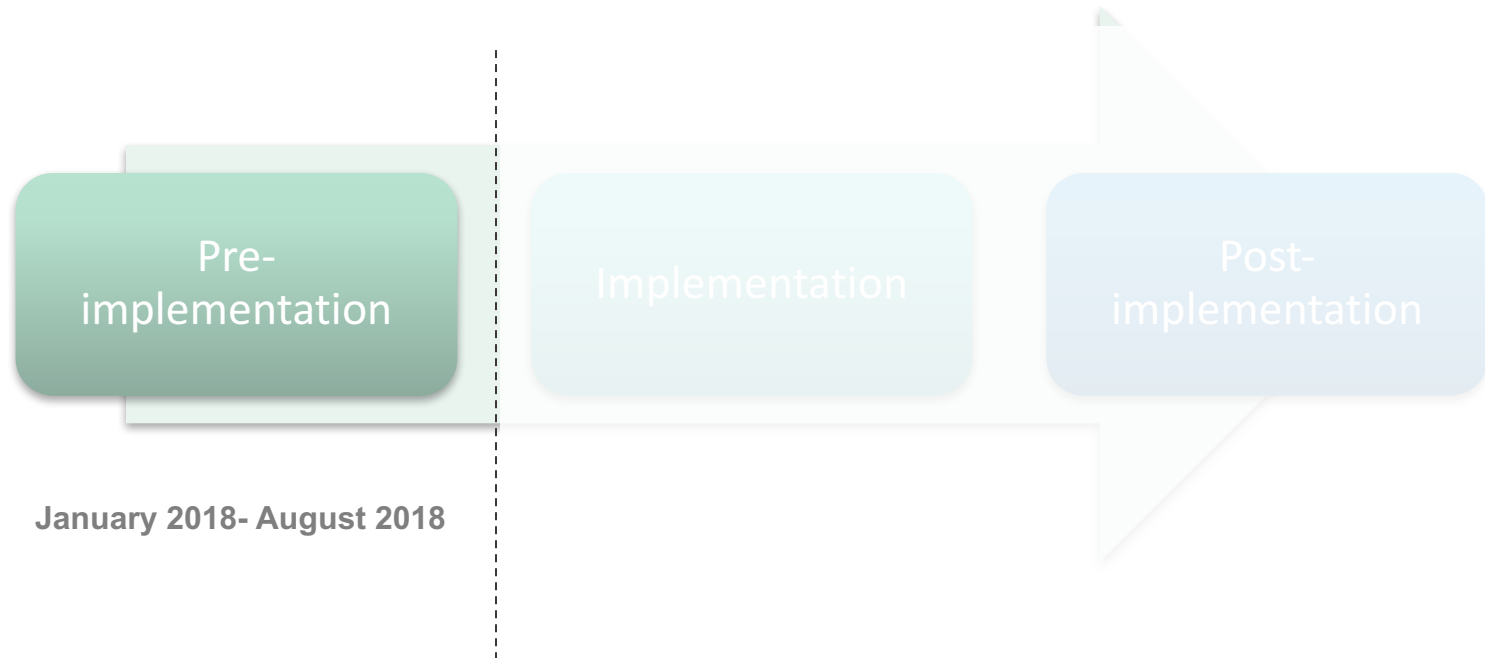

Implementation strategy. Phases



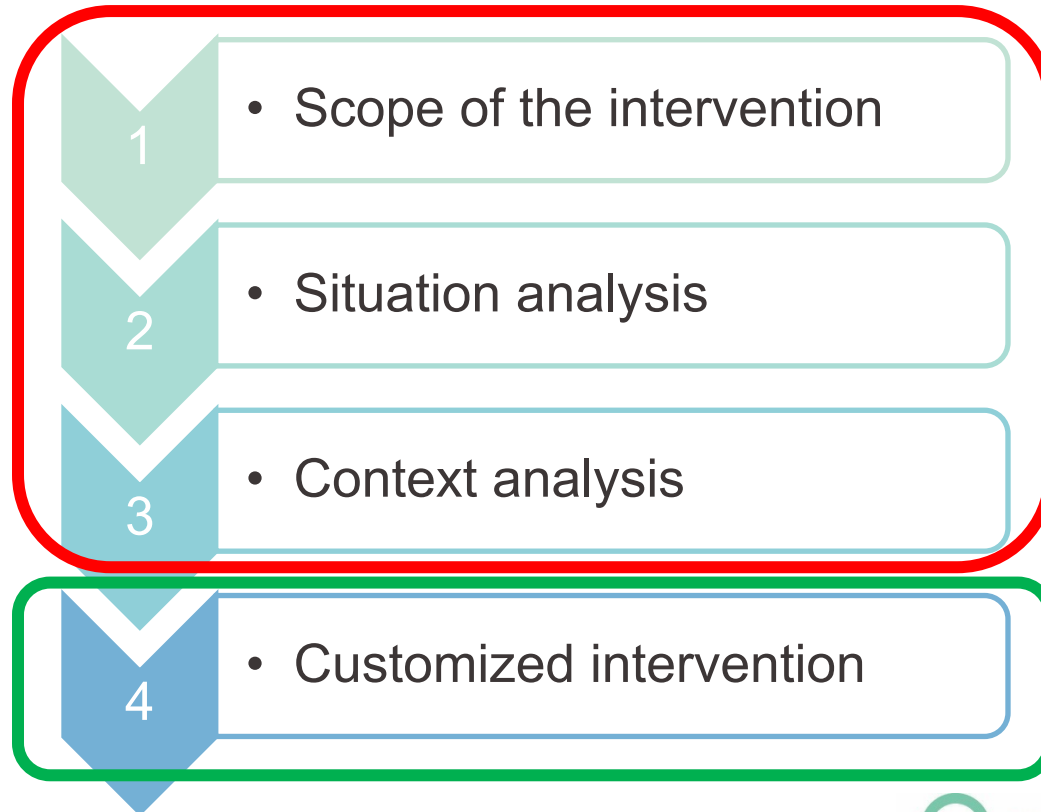
Implementation strategy. Phases



Pre-implementation phase

- Identify, specify and analyze determinants which act as barriers and enablers that influence implementation outcomes
- Define the actions to implement.

Customized intervention. Collaborative methodology

What is the collaborative methodology?

The collaborative approach requires groups to come together periodically to learn change ideas and quality methods, and to exchange their experiences with making changes.



Stimulates rapid improvement



Disseminate good ideas

Customized intervention. Collaborative methodology

1. Topic selection

- Select specific issue or area
- Existence of examples of good practices
- Research evidence about what is effective
- Improvements and benefits are of significance

- Provides faculty leadership

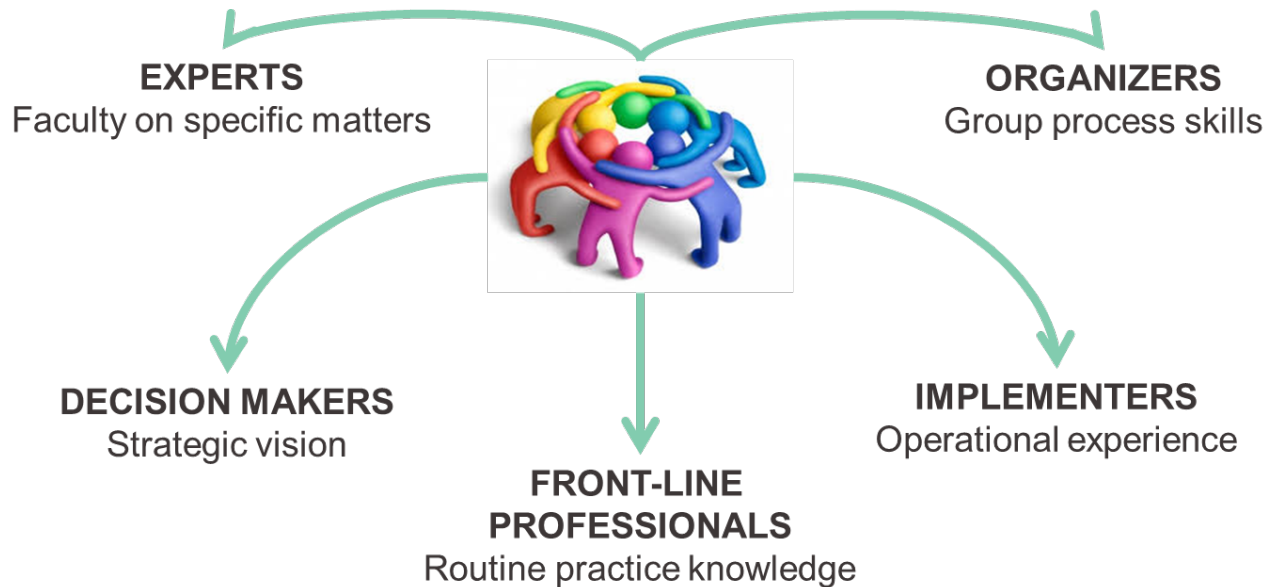
Application matter expert

- Guides teams on the improvement application

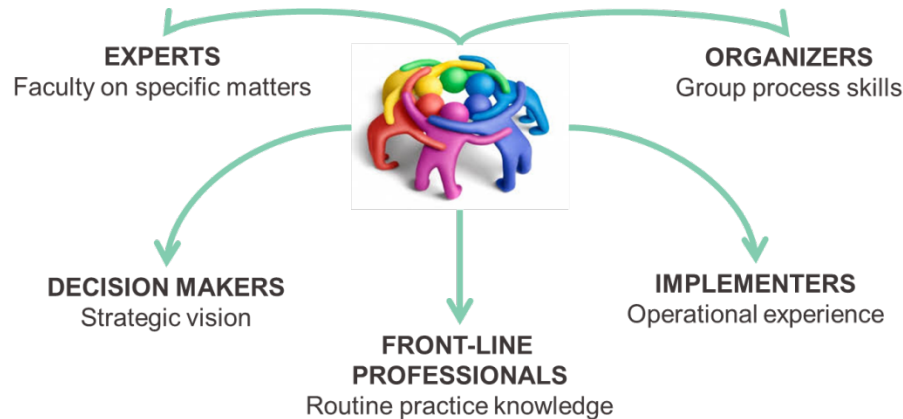

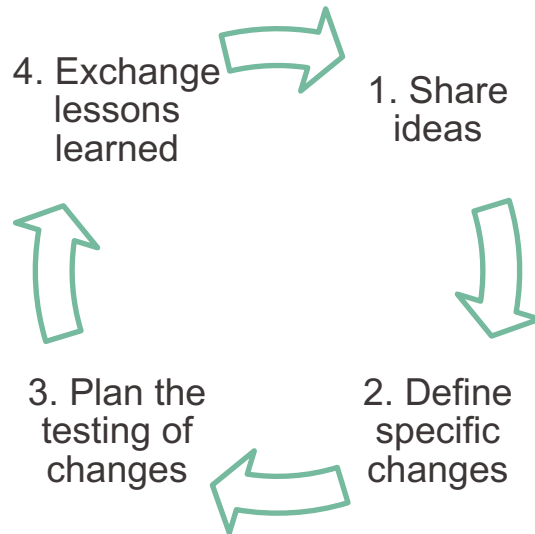

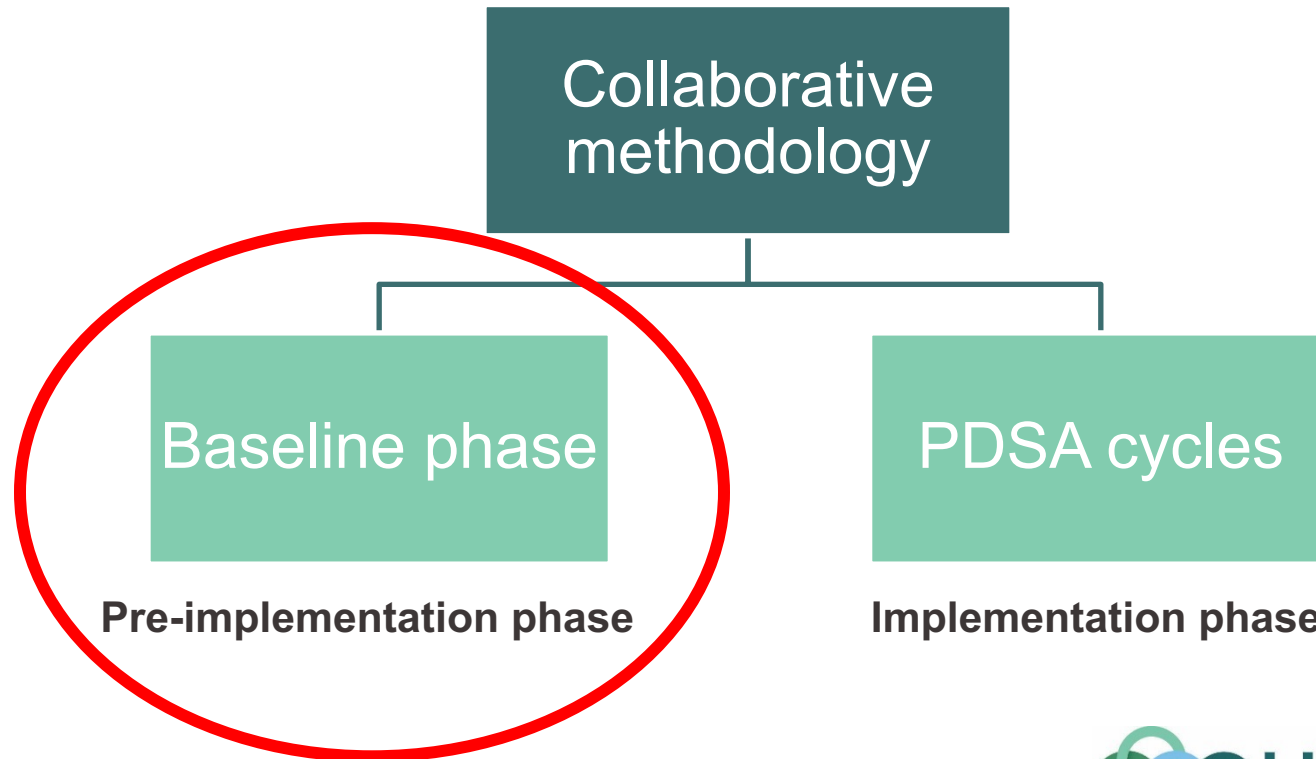


Customized intervention. Collaborative methodology

Suggestions for effective collaboratives

- ✓ Choose a subject with great evidence or practical examples of how to improve
- ✓ Define roles of collaborative participants
- ✓ Plan meetings carefully and provide teams with materials beforehand
- ✓ Support collaborative teams in change methods and dissemination of ideas
- ✓ Agree challenging but achievable and measurable indicators
- ✓ Use existing data
- ✓ Focus on change

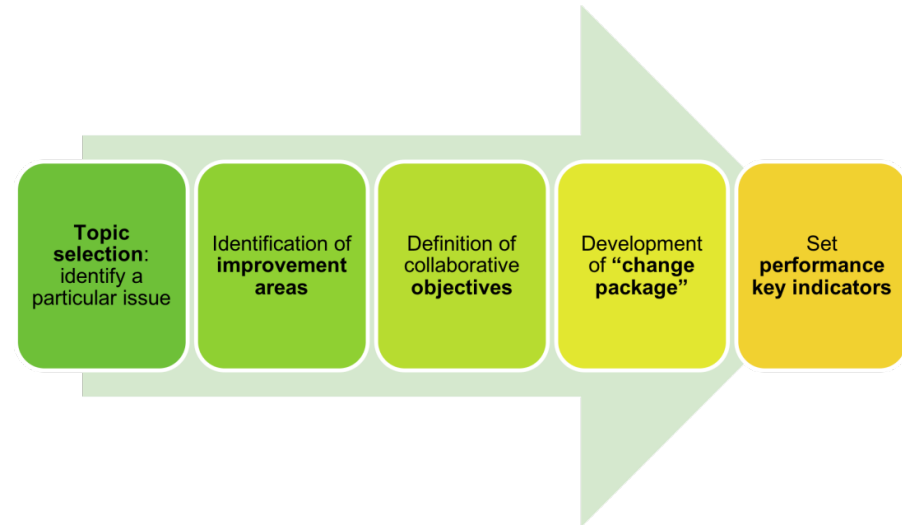
Localize the original good practice to local context and detail the interventions to implement that will cover specific improvement areas

❖ **Technique: Collaborative methodology**

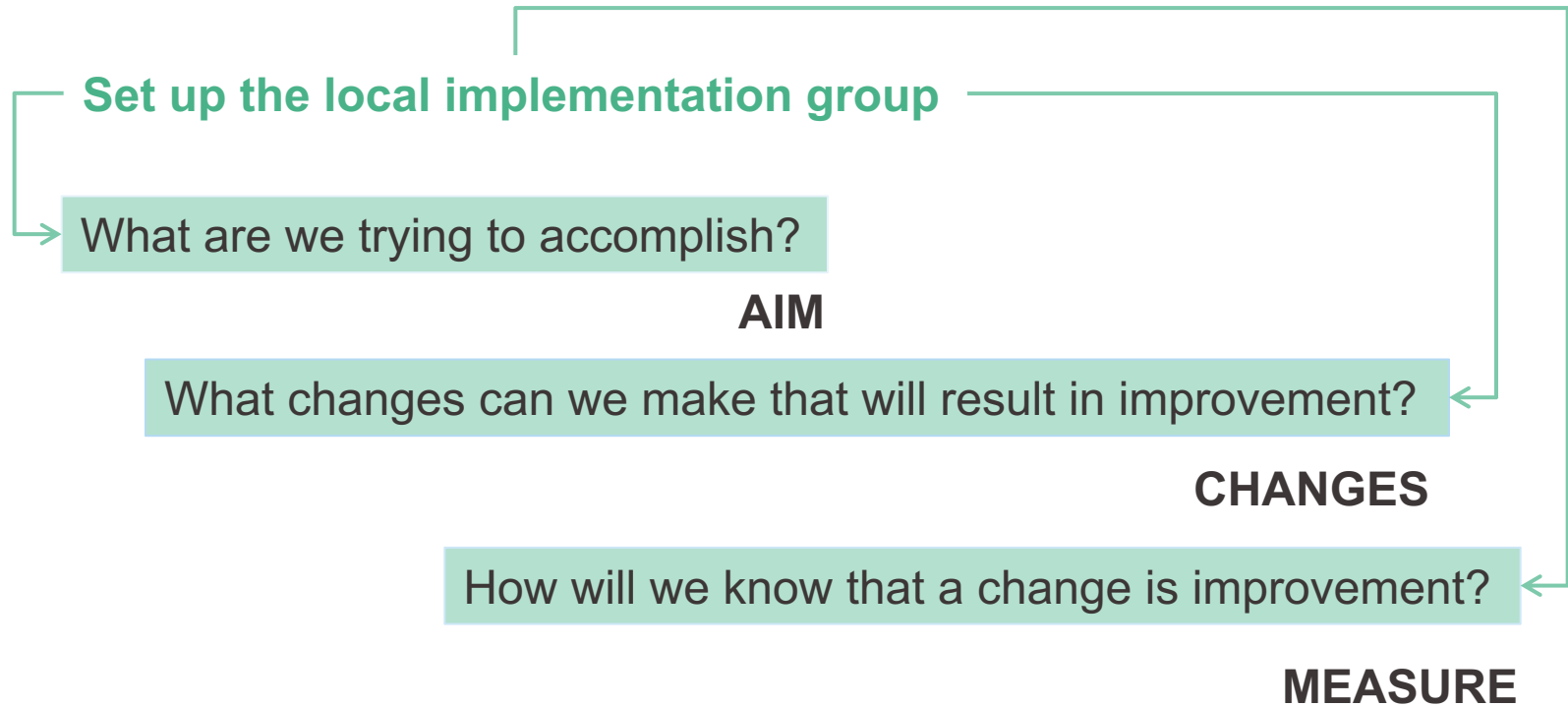
❖ **Process:**

- Identify the particular issues
- Detect improvement areas
- Specify concrete objectives
- Define actions to achieve objectives
- Agree on key performance indicators

❖ **Output:** Set of actions (“Change package”) that will result in practice improvement

Identify particular issues to work on.

Specify concrete objectives

What are we trying to accomplish?

Identify concrete improvement areas and specify achievable objectives for the collaborative

Improvement areas	Objectives

Customized intervention. Collaborative methodology

Define actions to achieve objectives

What changes can we make that will result in improvement?

Include information about the changes you can make. Look for scientific evidence to support the selection.

Objectives	Changes

Agree on key performance indicators

How will we know that a change is improvement?

Define the key performance indicators (health-related outcomes and process indicators).
