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# Integrated care for people with chronic wound



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- **Chronic wound – model condition for multimorbidity**
  - decreased quality of life (physical, psychological, social deprivation)
  - Impaired mobility, functional decline
  - Increased utilization of resources on different levels of the health-care system and in local community
- **Empowerment of patients and their carers**
- **Patient centered integrated care**



# What are we doing?

We are building the model for integration of care by putting fragments of care together.

We are establishing new connections among stakeholders in health care sector and in community and strengthening the old ones.

We are aiming to develop a care model for people with chronic conditions which can be implemented nationwide.

# Enablers



What helped you in the past and/or is helping you to use JA CHRODIS Quality Criteria and Recommendations (QCR Tool)

- 1. Management:** core management group makes sure there is a correlation between QCR Tool and the intervention
- 2. Time and diversity:** QCR Tool is being continuously used – Situation and context analysis, Pilot action plan development and implementation.
- 3. Language:** Translation of QCR Tool and speaking about it in the group is important



# Barriers



What was a barrier in the past and/or is still a barrier to the use JA CHRODIS Quality Criteria and Recommendations (QCR Tool)

- 1. Relatability:** It can be too abstract for some LIWG members – alienated from peoples' perception of WHAT is important in the intervention and HOW TO develop/implement it
- 2. Continuity:** The sustainability of the QCR Tool usage is questionable after the conclusion of the project
- 3. Time consuming:** Preparing translations and achieving common understandings

# Key messages



1. QCR Tool is a framework for context analysis and for development and reflection of the intervention
2. QCR Tool should be implemented in respect to the local context – categories can not be universal
3. Not everybody is comfortable with this kind of abstract thinking – the QCR ‘vocabulary’ should not be overused
4. The core management should be particularly familiar with the tool
