

Integration in National Policies and Sustainability. Consensus statement. Is there an opportunity for GB members to act?

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The sustainability and integration into national policies of CHRODIS proposals beyond 2020



- 1. WP4 is dedicated **to support EU MSs in implementing new or innovative policies and practices** that further strengthen empowerment, health promotion and prevention, and the management of chronic diseases and multi-morbidity.
- 2. WP4 partners will produce a report including an analysis regarding the sustainability and integration into national policies of CHRODIS proposals beyond 2020, as well as a **Consensus Statement concerning the EU added value of cross-country co**llaboration in the field of chronic diseases which will be submitted to the endorsement of the Governing Board (Deliverable 4.2).

What has been done:

- A **framework** to review the conceptualization of "Sustainability", "Integration in National Policies", and "European Added Value".
- An analysis and synthesis of the most relevant international initiatives and consensus about chronic diseases.
- A plan to foster the EU Ministries of Health involvement.

Then, SGGP members will be involved in a face-to-face meeting (next November)

- to discuss the survey results;
- To draft the Consensus Statement.

- **1. Governing Board** (GB) members and has been involved in different activities:
 - the Governing Board members, during the first meeting, held in Ulm (Germany) on June 2018, provided their expectations on the ways of collaboration with Joint Action partners;
 - Now, we would like to involve you in drafting a **SURVEY** which will target the Steering Group on Health Promotion, Disease Prevention and Management of NCDs (SGPP) members.
- 2. This **survey** includes questions on:
 - the priority areas in the policy agenda from MS,
 - the solutions that are more relevant for giving added value to the EU collaboration among MS which enable the integration and sustainability of NCD good practices into the national/regional policies/practices.

The survey



The survey aims to gather input from SGPP members and will be focused on:

- Priority action areas to prioritize the policy key areas based on EU Council conclusions on the field of NCD.
- 2. Sustainability, integration on national policies and EU added value to rank the effectiveness of the solutions highlighted in the framework.
- Operational advices and suggestions to provide advices and suggestions based on Country experience in implementing those solutions.

We expect to receive **one filled in questionnaire for each Member State**. The gathered information will represent the point of view of the Country and not the opinion of the filler

Time frame



Drafting the questionnaire

- 5th June: feedback from GB members;
- 6-14 June: further feedbacks from GB members;
- 7th June: survey presentation to SGPP;
- 15-26 June: setting the web version of the survey.

Participating to the survey

- 27th June: opening the survey;
- 6th September: closing the survey.

FOLLOW UP (Sep-Oct 2019)

After the closing of the survey, we will analyze the answers and, on the base of the results, we will draft a very first version of the consensus statement to present to the SGPP meeting in November. In this stage, your collaboration and active participation is welcome.
