


### Implementation in Lithuania

### Barriers to implementation

Lack of human resources

• Additional training for healthcare personnel is needed.

Some activities takes longer than expected

Surveys and data analysis are more time consuming than expected

Some patients might misinterpreted the questions of the survey

• There is a chance of more false positive answers than expected.







#### Support needed/provided to overcome barriers

#### Support provided by VULSK team:

Assign additional personnel responsible for coordinating the inclusion of patients and implementation of IMCM.

Organized additional meetings with front line implementers

Prepared a checklist template for LIWG personnel to follow the process of the protocol they must to do

Additional visits will be planned based on the needs of the individual practices.






